The year 2018 marks the 50th anniversary of the encyclical's publication, and its prophetic message is more timely than ever. A revised and improved translation of Pope Paul VI's encyclical letter, Humanae Vitae addresses the important concern of the moral use of contraception. It ultimately argues that the use of artificial contraception is immoral because it separates the unitive and procreative ends of marriage, both of which are necessary parts of God's plan for the institution and sacrament of Holy Matrimony. Very pertinent since we just had Natural Family Planning Week.

“Each day the people are to go out and gather their daily portion; thus will I test them, to see whether they follow my instructions or not.”
(Exodus 16:4)

When the Israelites gathered more than their daily portion of manna, the surplus became rotten. In our day, self-reliance, pride and ego can lead us to hoarding and keeping a surplus of goods and money. Living a Stewardship lifestyle helps us discern our *wants* from our *needs*. Living a generous lifestyle reminds us that God will provide all we need – with plenty to share!

A Steward from outside our parish found a great deal on disposable diapers. She donated SIX cases to be used in our Blessing Box and donated some to another crisis center. She didn’t allow her “*surplus to become rotten*” – rather she shared her bounty with others in need.
